Happy New Year! 2017 will bring at least one great adventure to some Midwest skiers and 'boarders. Elan Vital members will be headed for Norway in June. Not only will June afford almost 24 hours of daylight, but will also allow some possibly very good skiing near those magnificent fjords.

My only strong connection with Norway is having had the honor, privilege and pleasure to have the late Stein Eriksen's friendship. As anyone who even remotely knows or cares about skiing, Stein was the giant of them all, even though not what some would consider "tall". Stein and I, while standing together, were almost the same height (5'8"), but his lower center of gravity allowed him to ski as strongly and gracefully as any professional or non-professional skier whoever strapped on a pair of skis.

In my opinion, Stein epitomized the Olympic champion he was, bring much-deserved recognition to his native Norway. Stein was born into the ski business, since his father owned a ski manufacturing company in Norway. Stein told me his first time on skis was at age two.

I first met Stein when he had just been named Director of Skiing at Snowmass-at-Aspen. That was in 1969. I was doing my television weather and ski show in Las Vegas at the time and was invited to go on the inaugural flight of Aspen Airways from las Vegas to *Continued on page 3.*

SNOWLESS SNOW Neveplast at Buck Hill

For an exciting new snow-less downhill ski opportunity, a few of us had a meet-up at Buck Hill on October 22nd to try it out. Buck Hill is the first area to install this new snowless ski product. Of course, the bright blue and green colors catch your attention from a distance.... This is where the action is! The green area is infused with a silicone to make skiing smooth; the blue does not have the silicone and is used to slow you down on the edges and at the end.

There was a silicone lubrication pad to ski over at the top of the hill, to ready your skis. Immediately you notice there is a bit of sound from the Neveplast that you don't hear with snow. But if you close your eyes, the experience is just like spring skiing! Not as much carving, but you can get some speed up and can jump into the bag or try your talent at the terrain park.

At this time, the bunny hill, terrain park, ski jump, one run and the tubing area are set up with Neveplast.

One word of caution, older or non-"sintered" skis could become damaged on the surface. Then it's best to rent. Only one person in our group had problems. It definitely is a new, fun experience worth trying!!



Aspen and to meet and ski with Stein. It was a two day trip that morphed into four because of bad weather. Stein had a bad cold while we were there, thus my first meeting with him involved a photo op, some grins and goodbye.

When I moved to be on television in the Twin Cities, I continued doing my ski program in addition to the weather. One of my guests on the show in 1970 was a fellow named Don Urban who owned the Minneapolis Ski Show at that time, and for man y years afterward. He told me I could have as many of his star skiers on my program who were participating in his vendor-heavy show. One of them was Stein. He remembered our time at Snowmass and that resurrected an almost 50-year friendship.

Over the years we kept in touch, a lot. He once told listeners to my ski program on WJR in Detroit (where I had moved in 1978) that I had done more for the ski industry than any other media person he could name. That was quite an honor, coming from him.

Stein had a strong Detroit connection, as it was a former Detroit Studebaker dealer name Everett Kircher who bought and developed Boyne Mountain and enticed Stein to come to the U.S. shortly after Stein's Olympic victories. In addtion to offering the Director of Skiing position at Boyne, Kircher also offered him a free Studebaker. Stein told me that car offer was the clincher, and he moved to the U.S.

After Stein's years at Snowmass, he eventually was tapped to become Director of Skiing at Deer Valley, Utah. Two years before Deer Valley opened, Stein invited me to test the runs there, being transported to the top of the mountain on a snow-cat. Deer Valley used a pre-opening publicity shot of me raising my hands in the air with a thumbs-up on the back of the snow-cat. That photo was on pre-opening postcards sent to potential visitors to the new area. We repeated that the next year, one year before Deer Valley

opened. One morning, he and I went to the top of the mountain alone and he skied through deep powder in front of me. Like playing tennis with a better tennis player improves one's game, Stein had me skiing almost like him when I followed him down the mountain. He knew I'd never skied deep powder well, or at all, and when we paused to get our breath, he asked, "What is this crap about not being able to ski deep powder? What IS it? See, you DID it!" He then skied off at about 70 miles an hour down the hill and I just stood there petrified because I knew I couldn't replicate what he'd just had me experience a few minutes earlier. I eventually made it down the remainder of the mountain but I'll never forget that unique time with the world's great skier as my tutor.

I was Stein's guest at the opening and later stayed, as his guest, at his Stein Eriksen Lodge. I've been one very lucky boy.

Stein spent his summers at a ranch he owned near Ennis, Montana. We often talked on the phone, not only there, but also in Deer Valley. About four years ago, very sadly, nice person he was, he tried to avoid hitting a little girl on one of Deer Valley's runs and was seriously injured enough that he could ski no more. When Stein passed away last year the ski world lost its most wonderful role model and I definitely feel a void in MY life, too. I hope the Elan Vital's visitors to Norway will be able to find and visit Stein's birthplace this June. I've written about Stein and other ski experiences in my book, Barry ZeVan - My Life Among The Giants, A Memoir, and subtitled Thank you, Jerry Stiller...for urging me to write this book (which he did). It's available on Amazon with half the sales proceeds going to a different charity each month.
